SAE Re-Colonization Key Points Update

- The Preliminary Recruitment period for SAE began on September 12th and will span until December 5, 2008
- During this time period SAE will not be allowed to interact with or recruit freshmen in any manner including but not limited to phone calls, Facebook groups, Facebook invitations or mail delivery
- SAE will hold one information session per month, with an extra information session during Parent's Weekend targeting only upperclassmen
- In the preliminary recruitment time period, SAE may neither distribute a bid to any student nor conduct individual interviews with any student
- SAE will be encouraged to contact a diverse body of student groups at Duke in the fall, targeting students with a GPA above 3.0
- The Formal Recruitment period for SAE will commence two weeks after the conclusion of IFC's Formal Recruitment period and must conclude at the latest by March 31, 2009
- All new members are subject to university approval
